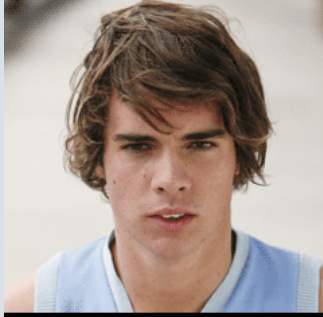
Well done boys. Lets keep this feeling going.
